**Paints:** 37 ml tubes

If you are inexperienced with color bring:

TITANIUM WHITE, CADMIUM YELLOW MEDIUM, ALIZARIN CRIMSON,  
ULTRAMARINE BLUE

Otherwise bring a full palette:

TITANIUM WHITE, CADMIUM LEMON, CADMIUM YELLOW MEDIUM, CADMIUM  
ORANGE, CADMIUM SCARLET, ALIZARIN CRIMSON, CERULEAN BLUE,  
ULTRAMARINE BLUE, PERMANENT GREEN LIGHT, PHTHALO GREEN IVORY BLACK  
A few extra colors such as Transparent Oxide Yellow and Cobalt Turquoise are a wonderful  
addition to any palette.**Canvas:** You will also need 2 small CANVAS PANELS  
6x 8, 9x12, 14 x18, (nothing larger than 16x 20).**Easel:** A Pouchade Box set up or a French Easel will be necessary.**Brushes:** Bring decent quality oil painting brushes (ones that have a bit of spring in them!)  
Rathbones are great. Utrecht are good too. You may have a personal  
preference in either paint or brushes so use what you are comfortable with.**Medium:** Winsor Newton's "Liquin", Odorless Mineral Spirits (Gamsol or Equiv.)  
Jars with lids for settling dirty mineral spirits**Accessories:** 2 small, lightweight LED clamp on reading lights (one for your painting and one for  
your palette. Paper Towels (1 Roll) Bounty or Viva are great, a bag to store soiled rags, single  
type palette cup or tuna can for medium, tin can to clean brushes, sturdy jar with a tight lid to  
store, odorless Mineral Spirits, palette knife, 2" trowel shaped with a wooden handle, 12 x 16  
wooden or disposable paper palette, several 6 x 6" soft cotton rags (torn sheets or fine weave  
100% cotton that do not produce lint or pill), laytex or vinyl gloves, old shirt/apron/lab coat - to  
protect your clothing, hat and sunscreen**IMPORTANT NOTE FOR ACRYLIC PAINTERS:**This class is oriented toward oil paint but you are welcome to use acrylic paints if you like. You  
will need to make the following substitutions to the above list:

Solvent: You will not need a solvent. Medium: Acrylic gloss medium and an Acrylic Retarder.

Brushes: follow manufacturers recommendations

Accessories: In addition to those accessories mentioned above you should also have a small, fine  
spray atomizer and a kitchen sponge.
